ALL ABOUT CYPRUS

Cyprus President meets Cypriot community from the USA

President Christofias received a group of children from the Cypriot community in the United States, and referred to the history of the Presidential Palace and the Cyprus problem, pointing out the difficulties in efforts to solve the Cyprus problem due to Turkey's intransigent stance.

Addressing the children before their tour of the Presidential Palace, President Christofias noted that the talks for a Cyprus settlement were being carried out between the two communities, noting that, due to the Turkish stance, progress was slow.

He added that Turkish positions on the Cyprus problem were tough and that Turkey's EU accession course would be facilitated by a settlement.

President Christofias said that at this point Turkey's EU accession course was at a standstill due to its stance towards Cyprus, since many chapters of its accession negotiations have been frozen, and expressed hope that Turkey would make all necessary moves.

He also referred to the role of third parties in the history of the Republic of Cyprus, as well as efforts to solve the Cyprus problem, the pre-independence period and the British Bases in Cyprus, as well as Cyprus' geographical location which is of strategic importance.

President Christofias furthermore referred to the demonstrations in various neighbouring countries and pointed out that Turkey was "flirting" with Islamic countries.

He also mentioned the upcoming parliamentary elections, scheduled for May 22, noting that the pre-election campaign was already in full swing.

Cyprus, which joined the EU in 2004, has been divided since 1974, when Turkey invaded and occupied its northern third.

President Christofias and Turkish Cypriot leader Dervis Eroglu are currently engaged in UN-led negotiations with an aim to reunify the country, under a federal roof. ☀

AHI Hosts "Town Hall Screening" of Ground-breaking Cyprus Documentary

WASHINGTON, DC — The American Hellenic Institute (AHI) hosted a "Town Hall Screening" of the one-hour documentary "Cyprus Still Divided: A U.S. Foreign Policy Failure" at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church, Clearwater, Fla., on February 7, 2011. The screening was held in cooperation with Holy Trinity Church and the Pancyprian Association of Florida, and it was organized with the help of Archon Regional Commander and AHI member Theodore P. Vlahos, M.D. It was a huge success and attracted many of our local community members. A panel discussion featuring U.S. Rep. Gus M. Bilirakis (R-FL), who co-chairs the Congressional Caucus on Hellenic Issues, Dr. Van Coufoudakis, rector emeritus, University of Nicosia, and dean emeritus, School of Arts and

Sciences, Indiana University-Purdue University at Fort Wayne; and AHI President/COO Nick Larigakis followed the documentary's screening. "Our goal is to create awareness of the documentary's significance and encourage communities to urge their PBS affiliates to air the program." The documentary sheds light and scrutinizes U.S. foreign policy toward Cyprus surrounding the 1974 Turkish invasion. The American Hellenic Institute is a non-profit Greek American public policy center that works to strengthen relations between the United States and Greece and Cyprus, and within the Greek American community.

OUR OWN PANCYPRIAN “HARRY” WINS X-FACTOR3 CONTEST

X Factor3 started 7 months ago with over a thousand contestants from all over Europe, USA, and Canada going for their dream in singing, but after many auditions, only 16 were chosen to go on the Live Show of X-Factor3 in Greece. We were very proud that our grandson, Harry Antoniou, was one of them. The live show started October 29, 2010, and continued every Friday; at the end of each show one contestant was eliminated. Our home was full of family and friends every week, cheering, voting, routing for Harry. At the end of each show, happy that he made it to the next, we celebrated with food, wine and plenty of desserts.

Harry was born on March 9, 1989 in New York, to Christina (Theofanus) Antoniou (photographer of the Pancyprian Soccer Team in NY during her school years...) and Tommy Antoniou (from Famagusta). He moved to Cyprus with his family when he was about 3 years old. On our first trip to visit them, Pappou Harry and I bought him his first saxophone from Florida and took it with us. At the age of 6 he took lessons for some months, and continued on his own. At the age of 15 Harry won 3rd place in a saxophone contest throughout Cyprus.

Harry graduated from the Grammar School in Limassol, served his 2 years Army term, where he was part of the National Guard Band (filarmoniki της εθνικής φρουράς Κύπρου ΣΜΕΦ.) He was also a singer and the Saxophone player of the group “189”. He registered at Cambridge in England to continue his studies in Music, but...X-Factor auditions came along at the same time... and here he is...

We are all so proud of him not only that he was called ΘΕΙΚΟΣ ΤΡΑΓΟΥΔΙΣΤΗΣ ΜΕ ΒΕΛΟΥΔΕΝΙΑ ΦΩΝΗ but mainly for his personality and good character he displayed, after so many months of pressure and competition, and was commented on by the judges again and again. We are very proud grandparents!!! With the Win, Harry earned a 3 year recording contract with SONY Records and a brand new car. We will follow his career and keep you posted. **THANK YOU ALL for your love & support.**



Ted Giavis (1920-2008) was a second generation Greek-American born in Lowell, Mass. He earned a scholarship at the Massachusetts College of Art and was a member of the prestigious Society of Illustrators for many years.

The Army spotted his talent, and ordered him to draw on company time. Mr. Giavis happily obliged, painting portraits of generals and filling up sketch books with scenes from Guam and Japan in World War II.

His two page parade scene for Goodyear advertising which appeared in a 1960 issue of the Saturday Evening Post, received international acclaim. Dr. Chris Mullen of the University of Brighton's Art School would cite the illustration 37 years later, when it ranked Mr. Giavis No. 8 on its list of the top 12 American realist artists. Most prominent on the list includes Norman Rockwell, Robert Riggs, Steve Dohanos, Lymon Anderson.

He and his wife, Theano, moved to Palm Harbor in 1996 from Westport, Conn., where he continued to enjoy painting including the series of the Pony Express. 🌸
